1. ODOT Final Legislation for Paving SR43 and Haymaker Bridge Repairs

Jim has asked for Council's approval of the final project legislation required to move forward with ODOT's paving of SR43 (from West Main Street north to the City limits) along with a few bridge repairs on Haymaker Parkway. ODOT would like to advertise this project for construction bidding in August which is why Jim asked for Council's immediate attention to this item as a special Council session in July. (attachment)

Administration Recommendation

The project local match funding will be provided in the City's Capital Plan (through some adjustments due to price escalation) and I recommend Council's authorization to approve the final project legislation as presented.

Council Action

Authorize the Ohio DOT final project legislation for paving SR43 and minor bridge repairs, with the budget appropriations, as presented with the emergency clause.

Unauthorized Items

1. Authorization to Accept and Allocate a Donation to Parks & Recreation

Angela has requested Council's authorization to accept and allocate a \$350 donation to Kent Parks & Recreation from Hippy Fox Rocks Inc., to support youth sports cheerleading. (attachment)

Council Action

Authorize the acceptance and allocation of the \$350 donation to Kent Parks & Recreation from Hippy Fox Rocks, Inc., with the Emergency Clause.

2. Authorization to Accept a Donation to the Kent Health Department

Joan has requested Council's authorization to accept a donation of homecare products from Portage County Developmental Disabilities Agency with an estimated value of \$100. (attachment)

Administration Recommendation

I recommend Council's authorization to accept the donated items with an estimated value of \$100.

Council Action

Authorize the acceptance of the donated homecare products valued at \$100 to the Kent Health Department, with the Emergency Clause.



Information Items

1. Monthly Permit and Zoning Reports

Bridget Susel has enclosed copies of the monthly zoning and permit violations report for April 2022. Permit revenues were \$10,217.16 for April with the most permits being issued for Residential Electrical (67 permits). There were 12 code enforcement items for the month. (attachment)

2. Kent Police Statistics

Chief Shearer has provided a copy of the police statistics report for June 2022. In 2022 calls for service are up 9% (162 calls); traffic citations are down 21% (39 tickets); accident incidents are up by 14% (5 incidents) and serious crimes are unchanged at 0 incidents compared to June of 2021.
